

Y TOP 10 Revision Tips Y from York Notes



Read the text

Give yourself time to read, think and explore the text!



Think for yourself

Mark up key sections and think about why an event or a choice of words stands out.



Make links and connections

Can you see parallels between characters or identify contrasting ideas? Do certain symbols or images crop up again and again?



Contextualise

Get to grips with the time or place so you know the context of the novel, play or poem.



Quote, quote, quote!

Back your quotes up with evidence and remember to embed your quotations, too.



Read aloud

Listen to the sounds of words, the rhythm of the language. This can help you to understand the text and identify literary techniques.



Confront difficult passages!

Break them down and find a way that works for you: group study, performance, annotation, etc.



Use the correct terminology

Express yourself in a sophisticated way, use appropriate literary terms and explain their effect.



Make effective notes



Be inspired!



Use colour or type them, but make your notes work for you. We all learn differently!



See a production, watch the DVD, act it out – anything that inspires you and helps you to see the text differently!
